About Us

WHAT IS THE F PROJECT?

The F Project began in 2008 when a wonderful group of Warrnambool women saved trailer loads of Fletcher Jones fabric from going into landfill. The closure of the iconic local clothing factory coincided with the loss of several arts institutions and performance venues, leading to a sense of crisis within the arts community. The F Project was established to support local artists and foster the engagement of our community through creative and meaningful arts projects.

Today The F Project includes an Art Gallery, a Retail Shop, Studios, workshop spaces and an Artist Residency, all in the heart of Warrnmabool's CBD. We also run a film society, garden events, artists' markets and an annual community Christmas Party!

We have a current membership of 200 paid members, 1000 newsletter subscribers, a team of over 50 volunteers and many thousands of visitors every year.

Guests have their own well appointed bedroom and shared facilities. We have 3 showers (+ 1 bath), a shared kitchen and dining area, shared lounge and extensive gardens. This open call is limited to 3 artists at a time (plus partners).

The residency is open to practitioners from traditional arts disciplines and working in different media, such as photography, text, fine art and poetry. Curators, artistic directors, visionaries and ideas people are invited to propose events, gatherings, exhibitions and other creative initiatives.

Studios, Workspaces and Gallery spaces may be available. Please enquire.

Artist Residency Rates

Available for up to four weeks off season (June - October).

Room with shared facilities: \$1,000 per week

Minimum 2 week stay, maximum 4 weeks. Rates include a partner. Dependents are an extra \$420 per week.

Whole house: \$2,400 per week

The workshop spaces have running water, storage, bench space, chairs, heating and lighting and basic tools. The F Project is equipped for Printmaking, painting and drawing. If you have further requirements for your practice we may have equipment - please enquire directly.

The F Project precinct is a live space, utilised daily by hundreds of people from the Warrnambool region. You will meet many other artists on site, and have the opportunity to work alongside them or collaborate with them. The workshops are a shared space, booked by appointment.





Workshop Dimensions




The F Project gardens are available for small events and performances.










The city of Warrnambool is a popular seaside destination, with beautiful beaches and a deep history.
